# April Meeting: Something way out of the ordinary!

Pre-meeting warmup music was provided first by Yours Truly, then by Lou Di Maggio who thinks he's not ready to perform for the club yet, but we know better! He's fantastic!

First on the show was The Aurora Mandolin Orchestra ably led by their lovely and charismatic director, Josephine Pellegrini who also was their spokesperson. Providing the accordion presence in the group was Pres. Peter Di Bono. Wow! What a sound a group of mandolins makes! Mellow, harmonious, awesome. Soprano Maria Fassio Pignati sang some gorgeous vocals; another vocalist was Lincoln Smith, who also was a player. Other players were Iona Ali, Satoshi Mukaida (1st mandolin); Janice Fournier, Bob Rizzetto, Lincoln Smith (2nd mandolin); Matt Vuksinich (mandola); Tom Romero (guitar); and Noell Toso (bass). We enjoyed Anema e Core, Prière Musicale (which contained a beautiful French tune that I've heard many times); the familiar Chitarra Romana; Sul Lago di Molveno; Comme Facette Mammeta; La Cumparsita (vocal by Lincoln Smith); Marechiare (Neapolitan song); Non Ti Scordar di Me (Do Not Forget Me), with Maria doing vocal; Le Tango Du Pardon, La Vita e Bella (from the movie Life Is Beautiful); Soul of Russia medley, arr. L. Papparello. The encore was the familiar Tarantella Napolitana. Each and every performer in the group has a very important part. I know from playing with the ACE Ensemble that there is a big "hole" in the music if any part is missing. This group is absolutely fantastic, and we hope they will come back again!

Intermission followed, featuring once again, a magnificent spread of all kinds of food and sweets. Our congratulations and thanks to **Tuti Weber**, our excellent cateress, who is always cheerful and looking for ways to please. How fortunate we are!

Following intermission and the drawings for prizes (cash and otherwise), Peter announced that **Sheri Mignano** was present. She has a wonderful group called *Zighi Baci* and also wrote a

book, Mandolins, Like Salami, a 200-page book in 8 1/2 by 11" format, that is a social history with biographical sketches and sample programs dating back to the early 20th century. # About our Performers for May


Chuck Berger has been a professional performer for 40 years. His repertoire consists of the Big Band sounds of the 40's, through music of the 70's and 80's! Chuck is proud to play a Petosa AM-1100 MIDI accordion. Through the early years of his career, polka music was his mainstay while working with the big name polka bands in the Midwest. With the advent of the MIDI accordion, he now precisely emulates all styles of music, whether it be Big Band, country, vocal groups, or polkas and waltzes (Swiss, German, Italian, Polish to name a few). His sound from stage is equivalent to a 14-piece orchestra, without the aid of computer-generated background.

Each instrument heard is actually being played by Chuck. Chuck continuously performs for such events as the prestigious USBDA Association, polka dances and festivals, exclusive county clubs, private dance clubs, anniversaries, dinner shows, conventions, and cruise ships. Because of his love of the accordion, he goes out of his way to perform for accordion clubs throughout the US. He is a true crowd pleaser.

Alex Yasko, whom we have known in the past as Alex Yaskin, has reinvented himself musically and is eager to show us what he has accomplished. Alex has been popular in the Bay Area in the past. He has an incredible repertoire covering every ethnicity and every type of music/dance. Alex was born in Belarus and has music degrees from Tchaikovsky Music School and Socolovsky Music College as well as a Bachelor of Arts in Music. He immigrated to the United States in 1994 and became a professional accordionist in San Francisco. Besides the accordion, Alex also plays the bayan, guitar, piano, balalaika and — the "accordion case drum"! He has also been a performer at the Cotati accordion Festival.






