Ron Borelli, pianist and accordionist, performs throughout the San Francisco Bay Area as a soloist or with his combo. Ron has played for hundreds of venues and special occasions including San Francisco's Bimbo's 365 Club, the Fairmont and St. Francis Hotels, the San Francisco Opera, the San Francisco Symphony and the Las Vegas International Accordion Convention, to name just a few.

Bossa Nova Nights

Consisting of Ron Borelli on accordion, Tomoko Funaki on string bass and Lisa Sanchez on guitar, Bossa Nova Nights plays the music of Brazil. The trio features Lisa Sanchez on vocals and guitar with a strong emphasis of the accordion soloing

Lou Jacklich is a popular SFAC guest performer. As a professional accordion soloist and leader in combos, his music has broadly reached public [radio, tv, county fairs, night clubs, local events including Cotati, accordion festivals, etc.] and private audiences.

In the 1950s the *Jacklich School of Music* in Castro Valley had four accordion bands and 19 combos, seven instructors and 400 students. He has taught over 1,000 accordion students. He now teaches accordion in his San Lorenzo, CA studio and via Skype. His students have benefited from his musical artistry, talent and mentoring; some have become pros. Two of his students, **Colette Ogata** and **Pamela Tom**, are performing this month.

In 1960, Lou ventured in a new direction as an early electronic accordion pioneer. He was introduced to Ken Lovell who invented an organ attachment for the *La Melodiosa* accordion which was probably the first electronically equipped accordion on the West Coast. Lou had a specially designed *La Melodiosa* accordion which had 43 treble keys, and 140 bass buttons. He was also a *Capitol* custom recording artist with the electronic accordion.

Lou Jacklich is an accordionist's accordionist. He has received many honors for advancing the accordion in society through performance, teaching and other leadership roles (e.g., pioneer, competition judge, band leader, arranger, and publisher). In 2014, the SFAC issued its first Life Time Achievement Award to Lou Jacklich. In 2017 California Senator Bob Wieckowski's staff delivered a Certificate of Recognition commemorating Mr. Jacklich's professional accomplishments. Lou was twice feted in 2016 — as the Cotati Festival Honorary Director, and with the Las Vegas International Accordion Convention's inaugural Art Van Damme Education Award.

Colette Ogata began her accordion career at age 8 with group lessons taken from a door-to-door salesman. When he came to the door, he pulled out a 12-bass accordion and demonstrated it. It was the first time she had ever seen an accordion and she begged her Mom to let her take lessons. The group lessons took place in a Church at the end of the street, and she had to get herself there on foot while carrying her very heavy, awkward 12 bass accordion. Months passed. But one day when she showed up for the group class nobody was there! He was gone, the teacher had disappeared.



Later Mom found Sam Totaro of Hayward, right out of the phone book. Colette took lessons from him for a few years beginning in 1970. In 1980 Mom saw a newspaper ad soliciting accordion players to join an accordion band that played on B street in Hayward. And that is how Colette met Lou Jacklich, who was the organizer/conductor of the *International Adult Accordion Band*. They practiced every Tuesday evening at a deli and played at Rossmoor, Walnut Creek, Pleasanton, and San Mateo fairs, at the Bay Fair Mall, and elsewhere.

After not seeing Lou for a while, Colette looked him up in 1998 and began formal lessons that went on for 3 years. In 2014, she visited the **Petosa**, Zero Sette, Bugari, and Borsini accordion factories in Castelfidardo, Italy. By the year 2016 she had started taking lessons once again with Lou.

Beyond her accordion life, Colette has worked at Kaiser Permanente for 26 years, the last 16 years as a Health Care Spanish Interpreter. She remains passionate about attending Accordion conventions and festivals, and in fact all things accordion!

Pamela Tom, San Francisco native, first began entertaining audiences at age 12, as a pianist for church, weddings, teas, and choirs.



Since 2011, Pamela trains under the tutelage of legendary SF Bay Area accordion teacher, Lou Jacklich. She performs privately and publicly statewide and nationally.

She placed first in the pop category at the 2014 and 2015 Accordionists and Teachers Guild, International Competition and Festivals in California and Illinois. Her repertoire features a wide genre of selections including: French, Italian, Latin, Oktoberfest, country, Broadway, western, rock, Beatles, light classical, Christmas, children, gospel and 30's to 60's. She has performed at birthday parties, retirements, weddings, receptions, and memorials.






