SFAC in July: Featuring Michael Zampiceni!



Raised with accordions from birth, **Mike Zampiceni's** father, Joseph Zampiceni, was a noted accordionist, teacher, composer, arranger, and music publisher several decades ago. At age 8 Mike began formal accordion studies, and by 11 was playing for paid engagements. He joined his father's orchestra at 14, playing accordion and drums, and by 17 he joined the musician's union and became the leader of his own band. Mike went on to earn both a bachelors and masters degree in music from San Jose State University, with performance concentrations in voice and classical

organ. Throughout his career as a technical writer from which he recently retired, Mike found time to continue performing and teaching. His passionate genres revolve around classical music and jazz, but he also has a penchant for Latin music, particularly Brazilian jazz. He also has a repertoire of ethnic European music.

Also performing in July, **Don Savant**, an Oakland native who took accordion lessons for two years with a teacher from Meniketti Studio beginning at age ten. He took up the accordion again as a junior in high school after seeing the younger John Molinari play, and purchased his white Giulietti from John Sr. It stayed in the closet for years,

He likes playing oldies from his parents' era, and has played venues including the Filoli Ballroom, and Red Wall Cavern at mile 33 of a fifteen-day raft trip through the Grand Canyon!

Also in July: Don Savant, Siyuan Donnelly, Daniel Cher, Lynn Ewing

Siyuan Donnelly started playing accordion in his kindergarten class in Shanghai two years ago

when he was four years old. Since moving to California a year ago, Siyuan has become a student of Mike Zampiceni. Siyuan and his parents feel very lucky to have found Mike-he's a wonderful teacher. Siyuan displays mu-



sical discipline and maturity beyond his years, and Mike is always pleasantly surprised with what Siyuan has undertaken on his own at each lesson. Siyuan seems to enjoy playing, and likes the strong sound an accordion makes. He is also something of an extrovert, and seems to like playing for people. Besides playing for the SFAC in July, he'll be playing on the Saturday morning student stage at the upcoming Cotati festival.

Dr. Daniel Cher is a professional-level violinist



who also noodles on the piano and still remembers some of his harmony class from 30 years ago. He is a founding member of the St. Michael Trio, considered Silicon Valley's update to the world of classical music, and he has played with professional orchestras including New Century Chamber Orchestra, Orchestra New England, and

the New Haven Symphony. He had an accordion epiphany two years ago and has studied jazz improvisation with Mike for most of that time. When he's not working on learning progressive chords on the accordion, Daniel designs and implements clinical trials for Bay Area medical device companies.

Lynn Ewing, the current President of SFAC, was born and raised in San Diego, where she start-

ed playing accordion at age seven. As a young adult, Lynn taught at the Robert Mitchell Accordion School, where she directed five accordion bands and gave accordion lessons to over a hundred young children. She received her certification in the



instruction from Mills College, and was the music specialist at El Granada Elementary school for 7 years. Currently Lynn teaches private accordion students, and performs with two accordion ensembles, the San Francisco Accordion Chamber Ensemble (ACE) and AbsolutAccord.

June Meeting Review

What better way to kick off our musical program than having **Reno Di Bono** render rapid-fire versions of mostly familiar pieces spanning many genres and musical eras. After starting with a very bright and hand-clapping Italian Polka, he quickly launched into exactly

43 seconds of a frenetic *Tico Tico*, explaining "This is the warmup!" That passed into a "cool off" connected to another even more frenetic short piece! Reno then slowed the pace down with a very



pretty version of one of his favorite songs, Gershwin's London Town. This led perfectly into another tune seemingly from the same well, a soulful rendition of When Sunny Gets Blue (Nat King Cole, Johnny Mathis). Admitting that the song sounds better on a guitar than on an accordion (what?!), Reno jumped into a boss nova and then another short piece. We next got to hear Cherokee (also known as "Cherokee (Indian Love Song)", a jazz standard written by Ray Noble and published in 1938. Although Reno lamented after the next song that it was very hard to resist speeding it up and losing control of the pace, we were treated to a gorgeous version of After You've Gone, a 1918 popular song. It took me a little time to identify the next all-toofamiliar opera song, but I eventually realized it was Nessun Dorma, from Puccini's Turandot. Reno concluded his set with a modern Italian ("even Sicilian!") song from the 1988 movie "Cinema Paradiso," the title track Cinema Paradiso by the great Ennio Morricone.

Dina Gutkina first performed for the SFAC in the early 1990s, on a day when she just showed up with her bayan. After an elapse of approximately 25 years, just

this April she once again just showed up at one of our meetings to accompany bayan artist Stas Venglevski, in one of the most memorable concerts in the history of the

SFAC. We were so honored to have her back in just 2 months' time, rather than having to wait another quarter century! Dina played a series of pieces by Russian composers. I can honestly say I did not recognize any of the songs, nor was I



able to hear any of the titles or composers clearly enough to do any research after the fact. I guess I will have to brush up on my Russian or Belarusian, the official languages of Dina's native country Belarus, prior to Dina's next appearance at one of our musical programs! I can say that her 20 minute set was an extremely passionate and energetic rendition of Russian music immediately identifiable as such. It is hard to define what we mean by "Russian music" but we know it when we hear it – thanks Dina!

Well, it takes several decades to make an accordionist like **Ron Harris** – it just does. It's not just about the technical features of the particular accordion, although



we certainly we have seen many unique designs at our programs; nor is it just about the virtuosity of the musicians, granted having been blessed to hear many of the world's finest at our programs. Ron is an entertainer's entertainer, whose connection to the

audience transcends all else. I can safely say that every song he played affected every person in the room, bringing them back to a time and a place when that song was important in that person's life. Ron opened with a tight medley of Pennies from Heaven, All of Me, and Somewhere Over the Rainbow. His style and pacing made me think of Mr. Volpi, who plays in the bar of the Petaluma restaurant featuring his name, except Ron's arrangements were more recognizable and, well, longer in duration! A romantic rendering of Torna a Surriento led to two closing songs that I personally heard first in ultrapop versions: Jerome Kern's Can't Help Lovin' Dat Man (Doo Wop version by The Hideaways out of Philadelphia, c.1960), and Jack Lawrence's Linda (covered by surf rockers Jan and Dean in 1963). The song Linda, by the way, was written about then one-year-old future star Linda McCartney!

After the intermission, headliner **Paul Pasquali** introduced us to his incredible invention, the <u>Concerto</u> – the state-of-the-art digital/acoustic instrument, which Paul



states is the world's 1st true digital accordion. Paul is the owner of **Accordions International** in Salt Lake City (www.accordionfactory.com), and organizer of the annual Las Vegas Accordion Convention (coming up August 8-11, 2016 – see www.accordionstars.com). Although Paul certainly played some beautiful music, his set was an

awesome demonstration of the technical wizardry of the instrument itself, and of course his mastery of its seemingly infinite possibilities to render orchestral music, replete with sections of string (violin, viola, cello and double bass), brass, woodwind, and percussion instruments. Paul was way too impatient to play any song from beginning to end, as he kept seeing opportunities to musically digress and to provide exemplars of the Concerto's larger -than-life sound. That stated, and through it all, we heard Never on Sunday; I left My Heart (in San Francisco); Grenada; Going Out of My Head; Calcutta; New York, New York; Memories (from the musical Cats); and finally, appropriately, Time to Say Goodbye. I thought Paul had intended to close his set right there, but on second thought he clearly wanted to play one more: The Battle Hymn of The Republic.

IN MEMORIAM: Giovanni "Papa Gianni" Giotta May 1, 1920 - June 11, 2016

Dear Friends, Colleagues and Customers: It is with "cuor' pesante" (heavy heart) that I must report to you the passing of my father. This little dynamo of a man founded our company, accomplished so much and made so many feel good with his personality, service and music. His unique expressions-his hands, his words and his songs, are preserved in history. He was at the core of my musical upbringing and life, and our world will never be the same without him.

In addition to everything else, Papa Gianni Giotta was a HUGE proponent of the accordion. When we watched the Lawrence Welk show on TV each week, he kept telling me to practice because one day, I was going to be on that show. My father was an incredibly strong backer of my accordion study, performance and related activities from the very beginning in 1971, sparing no expense for my education, work, success and satisfaction. He publicly sang the praises of the instrument and, of course I had been accompanying his vocals on accordion since 1972. We did one hell of a lot of singing and playing together, thousands of appearances; in studios, on stage and on camera...




