

A Truly Special Father's Day Event!

This year's June event on Father's Day offered a very special opportunity to celebrate the centennial of one of our most esteemed members and the music of a renowned accordion duo.

Our jam session was led by **Joseph Martin** and featured 9 players, including 2 guest players – **Gary Blair** and **Robin Hyland!** Our jam sessions are improving with each month, and it shows! Congratulations to the players who participated.



We celebrated **Ed Massolo's** upcoming 100th birthday (June 27th). Most of us know Ed as a very active Club member, who has been with it since its 1990 reincarnation as the "Bay Area Accordion Club". He served on its Board of Directors and was the creator/builder of the signage we see at the entry to each of our Chetcuti meetings. He also constructed the portable stage we used at Oyster Point for many years.

On this day we also celebrated a much more serious side to Ed. Although he is very humble about his WWII history, it is a fact that he volunteered for active duty in WWII, that he flew 25 missions in B-17 heavy bombers over German territory, was shot down, was a prisoner of war, was awarded the Purple Heart, the Air Medal with 3 Oak Leaf Clusters, and a Prisoner of War Medal! The Club was so honored to

celebrate the 100th birthday of this American hero. He also received on this day a **Letter of Congratulations** from Congressman Kevin Mullin (CA-15th district), which was beautifully presented in a leather-bound case.

Ed has been playing the accordion since age 9! The only time he stopped was during his military service. Ed thrilled us on his incredible Excelsior and perfectly played several songs: *El Rio Drive Polka*, a favorite of his which he first played for the Club *30 years ago*; *Sun and Shade Waltz* (to which a couple happily danced in our hall); and finally, two famous Italian love songs (recorded by Perry Como, Andrea Bocelli and others), *Anima e Cuore* and *Malafemmena*. Any one of these songs would have been challenging; Ed performed them both flawlessly and with precision. Ed's skills on the Excelsior were mesmerizing. So Ed, having played the accordion longer than most people will live, YOU STILL HAVE THE RIGHT STUFF! Congratulations and many thanks for all that you've achieved and are continuing to achieve in your career.

Our musical program continued with our featured performers, the renowned Scottish accordionist **Gary Blair** and second accordionist **Robin Hyland**. Many thanks to Rosemary Busher, who invited them, provided housing, meals, and

tours as they prepared for our Club, and earlier this week for the United Irish Community Center of San Francisco. Those of us who attended this earlier Friday evening Irish event enjoyed an awesome celebration of great music and dance.

This was Gary's third appearance for our Club (once at Oyster Point, once via Zoom, and this day). First up was a tune he had composed after his first appearance in the early 1990's and will play again at the upcoming Leavenworth (WA) Accordion Festival, entitled *Leavenworth Polka*. In Gary's typical style, it was joyful and fast. Next up was a wonderfully melodic waltz Gary wrote in honor of his late friend, titled *For John and Dave Waltz*, followed by a waltz he wrote for his late mother and father, *Lola and Jimmy Blair's Waltz*. So wonderful were these waltzes that a couple happily and elegantly danced away in our Chetcuti entry way! The Musette tones for both Robin's and Gary's accordions were so beautiful! Next was *Reginella Campagnola*




(*The Woodpecker Song*), which they recently performed at a Castelfidardo festival. Everyone was tapping their toes to this one. This performance reminded us just how powerful and versatile our favorite instrument is.

Next were some of Gary's favorite tunes: *Norwegian Hymn/Anna's Visa* and *The Hen's March to the Midden* and *The Chicken Reel* (musically, we could hear and envision the hen in this terrific piece!). This was followed by an American tune, *Whistling Rufus*, followed by another Gary Blair composition, *Waltz for Domi*, which Gary composed in honor of

Domi Emorine, a young French accordionist who was a senior world champion at age 15. Next was *Alpine Slopes*, which was composed by an Irishman as a Swiss tune, performed at our Club by two Scots in America on an Italian Accordion! So very, very international! Next were a couple of Scottish tunes and a couple of Irish jigs, then a waltz, then *Flick-Flack*, a true fingerbuster! It is one of Gary's signature songs, one that has made him such an admired performer, beautifully and flawlessly performed with Robin's superb accompaniment.



A bit slower was a lovely *Heidi's Waltz* (Gary Blair) followed by a riveting medley of multiple several reels, including the *Glasgow Reel* and *Jungle Reel*. (A Scottish reel is genre of social folk dance, Celtic in origin.) Just as we were settling in, Gary and



The first time Gary performed in America, Leavenworth 2001, Dick Contino also performed. Gary and Robin played a compilation of songs Gary arranged for American au-

diences at that time, which he's performed ever since. Entitled *American Express*, it opens with the familiar *Theme from Bonanza* (David Rose) and follows with a medley of favorite Americana songs, mostly 19th century and a few 20th century. It was a rousing way to end this duo's terrific performance.





Many thanks to Gary and Robin for a stunningly mesmerizing and uplifting performance. It doesn't get any better than this blastoff! And best wishes for a successful performance at Leavenworth Accordion Circle.

He treated us to his accordion and vocal talents nightly in open mic with his lovely wife Jamie, who is an extremely skilled accordionist and singer herself. We enjoyed workshops from Jamie on bass patterns, rhythms, and secrets to playing by ear. Courtney Von Drehle, another highly talented accordionist from the Portland area, also gave workshops and focused lessons in musicality from the Jacque Mornet methodology and treated us to rhythmic understand-

ing through tapping, clapping, counting, and playing. There also were opportunities to schedule a one-on-one lesson with Gabe, Jamie, or Courtney. Each night after dinner (following a full day of orchestra/small ensemble/independent practices, 1:1 lessons and workshops) there was time for open mic where accordionists could play a solo,

duet or trio for the rest of the group. And after open mic, there was a jam session with music books for all to play.

The last evening of camp culminated in a concert by the orchestra and solo performances by Gabe, Jamie, Courtney, and Gail Campanella. Gail not only delighted us with her solos for the concert and open mic, but also led one of the jam sessions, using her bass accordion to anchor the orchestra and keep all of us in proper time! We left camp as better accordionists and with new life-long friends.

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
