President's Message

We are very pleased to be able to present so many entertaining programs at our monthly musical meetings. We are fortunate to live in an area where there are so many fine musicians who are willing to share their talent with us. While some of them are our own members, we attract visitors from around the country and the world who play for us when they are here. We constantly search for talent, and we get together as a board to work out a schedule. Of course, our work is made easier when they contact us instead. And we gladly accept your suggestions of players who might be interested in coming to us at some future date. Just contact any board member with your ideas.

I thought you might like to know what is ahead for the next few months. This is a tentative schedule, subject to changes as needed.

March 15: our Sacramento-area-based group, the Accordion Magic 5, will be back to play for us with some fine new arrangements. They will also take turns playing solos. This group plays some great tunes, most of which are familiar to us, done in interesting arrangements.

The second half of the program will feature our own Peter Di Bono, certainly one of the very best musicians around. Peter will bring with him two excellent musicians to produce some very sweet sounds. Violinist Harriet Newhart and bassist Steve Hanson complete the trio.

April 19: To keep things in the family, we will have Peter's brother Reno Di Bono who will bring his trio back for another of his outstanding programs featuring a variety of pop tunes, jazz, and a smattering of Italian music, with Reno doing the vocals. The second part of the program will see a return of the San Francisco Accordion Chamber Ensemble, with Joe Smiell conducting. Included among his original arrangements will be Cowboy Rhapsody, American Sketch, and Grande Marcia Italiana.

May 17: Alex Roitman, a student of Peter Di Bono, will bring his tango band which he calls "Tangonero," to the club for their first appearance. We look forward to hearing them. Steve Balich from the North Bay will bring a few of the members of his band to play the second half of the program. Steve is well known to us and is one of the most beloved figures in the accordion community. He will have you dancing in the aisles, or at least tapping your toes to his music. (Continued on page 5)

March Program-WOW!

President Frank Montoro introduced visitors Darnell Howes and Bill Bates. Bill is president of the Deutscher Musikverein, a club of German musicians who have a big German brass band. This group has expressed an interest in teaming with us on some project. The San Francisco Accordion Band ("Fun Band") is working with Bill on a proposed musical collaboration in September. Stay tuned!

Frank also introduced two young ladies who are working on a research project: Julie Caine, an independent producer/journalist; and Marié Abe, a Ph.D. candidate in ethnomusicology at UC Berkeley. Frank also pointed out that two fine accordion repair people were present: Vince Cirelli and Skyler Fell.

Our very able warm-up accordionist was none other than **Sue Hirigoyen**. Nice job, Sue—thanks much!

First on the day's program was a very special presentation that was not musical! André Paris treated us to the amazing but nonpolitical story of a very special experience—one such as very few people ever have: He was the personal guest of President Obama at the

presidential inauguration. It is a long, incredible (but true) story; but in a nutshell, throughout his life as a teacher and soccer coach, André was very supportive and benevolent of youth in need. Thirty-five years ago, there was one such youth in Hawaii—a young boy by the name of Barack Obama. whom André took under his wing,

coached and mentored, and the favor was not forgotten. André was the special guest of the Obamas, not only for the inauguration, but in the White House, including breakfast at the same table (for 6) with the Obama family. "Uncle André," as Obama called him, was even invited to play the accordion—and a gleaming Excelsior appeared on a rolling table just for a stunned André to play! He played three songs for the appreciative family.

There is much, much more to the story, but what an adventure! André displayed several mementos of the trip and passed around three photo album/scrap books. Wow! No matter where one stands politically, or who the President is, being invited privately to the White House is a very high honor. Congratulations, André!

Then we heard our first musical performance: "Debbie and the Docs," consisting of Debbie Knapp on accordion, her hubby Jim (an ophthalmologist) on string bass and Josh Di Chicacchio (who recently earned his doctorate at the Eastman School of Music) on guitar. These are all accomplished musicians, and they played just beautifully. I probably missed some of the names, but they started out with a Gavotte by J. S. Bach; then a "Homage to Mozart" with Mozart's Rondo a la Turca, the familiar and lovely Für Elise. Debbie and Jim also performed some popular music, with Jim on bass: La Vie En Rose, Pigalle (of which Debbie dedicated the spaces to Joe Smiell—players in the ACE Ensemble and the Fun Band will understand!), Bésame Mucho, Torno a Surriento, Funiculli, Funicula with clapping by the audience, Bella Notte. Josh played a

beautiful solo, Asturias by
Isaac Albéniz.
They finished up with an American jazz piece, Eulipians, with a vocal by Debbie, who was playing the left hand only! What a classy and professional performance!



Jerry Choate, who lives up in Chico, comes around whenever he visits his sister in Emeryville, and we were very happy to welcome Jerry, who plays music that we all love to hear. Playing his Giulietti extended keyboard accordion, amplified, he played That's Amore, Always Happy Polka, Edelweiss, Ain't She Sweet, Bye Bye Blackbird, More,

Spanish Eyes, Moonglow as a medley with the theme from Picnic, Jennie's Mazurka (which Steve Balich wrote for his beautiful wife Jennie), Your Cheatin' Heart, and Schneewalzer. Smooth, relaxing and a delight to hear—thanks, Jerry!

After the break and a hearty HAPPY 90TH to Jim Holliday, we were treated to the Robert Reich Trio a.k.a. Nice Guy Trio, all young people:: Robert of course, on accordion;

Daniel Fabricant on bass and Darren Johnston on trumpet. Robert started off solo on his Titano accordion, playing Balajo, a waltz by French composer Jo Privat. He played a medley of Klezmer songs, and the audience clapped enthusiastically to the beat of the fast one. Robert has been playing accordion for a mere 8 years and is a real pro.

Then the whole trio played, first Off the Grid, written by

Darren Johnston, the trumpetist; then Stardust (Hoagy Carmichael); Fabbi's Footsteps, written by Daniel Fabricant (bassist): The Balancing Act and Unicycle Cocek, both composed by by Robert. There is a lot of talent among these three young men.

I have some thoughts that I'd like you to share with our accordion community. My very famous instrument, the Russian Bayan, that I have played since 1968, was made by special order with solid reed plates of copper (all hand made). It has been entirely repaired and restored by fellow SFAC member Yakov Puhachevsky (we call him Jacob). Jacob also contributes his free time to restore a Simon Shtauber 1952 Hohner Atlantic III.

The accordion community thanks Jacob for his personal contribution and tremendous job.

About Yakov Puhachevsky: He is a graduate of Kishinev (Republic of Moldova) Music School (1972) with honors. He holds a second degree in mechanical engineering that he received in 1977 from Moldova University.

Jacob studied accordion with Prof. I Birbrayer. He worked as an accordion master craftsman in Kishinev from 1964 until he emigrated to the US in 1991. Jacob has extensive experience in repair, restoration and tuning of various types of accordions, Russian Bayans, diatonic accordions and more. The accordion world needs to know about him. *Grigoriy*




