SFAC April Event Summary

All That Jazz!

Our vaunted jam band kicked off the meeting with a spirited jam session skillfully led by **Colette Ogata**, who has stepped up to fill in for her mentor, the Maestro Lou Jacklich, who is currently not able to continue leading our jams. Following the group jam, several players volunteered to perform solos, including **Don Savant**, who led off with a great take on *My Way*, followed by **Scott Anderson** with *Girl from*



Ipanema, and **Ken Schwartz** with *So in*

Love by Cole Porter. Ken, playing on the Club's Guerrini accordion, which was manufactured in San Francisco (circa 1947), played a bit of *That's Amore*, which Rosemary Busher and he had played at last year's Festa Italiana in San Francisco. The SFAC has been enthusiastically invited back by the organizers for this year's Festa, and will have a bigger role than ever, with so much of the festival featuring accordion music! Be there on June 2nd, in San Francisco's North Beach.

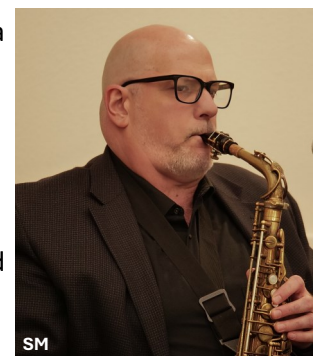
Our Featured Performer this month was **Steve Albini**. Steve last performed for the club in May, 2017, at which time this author wrote: "Our Featured Performer, Steve Albini, is one of those rare multi-talented performers who soars equally well on the accordion as with vocals, English or Italian."

Steve's performances of Italian music fused with jazz and world rhythms have brought him international acclaim. He was accompanied by a surprise guest – the equally talented **John Douglas**. John has had a lifetime of experience in music. He has taught privately for over 20 years, having performed professionally on saxophone, clarinet, and flute for over 35 years. He performs widely around the Bay Area, including in 3 bands, Brazilian groups, and others. Needless to say, John was perfect for this event!



The program was mostly classic jazz. John's alto saxophone, soprano saxophone (also favored by performer Kenny G), and clarinet were paired with Steve's vocals and Roland rhythmic accordion accompaniments. Steve is also a terrific singer, so there were actually 4 simultaneous lines for each song performed today: Steve's vocal lead and 3 rhythmic lines, comprising accordion treble, accordion bass, and John's woodwinds, including saxophone, clarinet and soprano sax. In all, they made for a unique, terrific musical combination!

Steve and John "warmed up" with *East of the Sun*, music and vocals sung by Steve. Next was *Baubles, Bangles and Beads*, written in 1953 as a waltz for the musical **Kismet**, but popularized by Frank Sinatra & Tom Jobim as a bossa nova. Steve called out the most recent memorialization of this jazz version of *Baubles* by John Pizzarelli, stating with some trepidation he had been working on his own accordion version. Not to worry Steve, your jazzed-up version was nothing short of wondrous!

SFAC April Event Summary

Next up was a bouncy vocal rendition of *I've Got the World on a String* (sitting on a rainbow, of course). Since Steve and well-known SFAC member Ron Borelli are preparing a tribute to the late singer Tony Bennett, the next few songs were



some of Bennett's trademark recordings: *I've Got the World on a String*, *Stranger in Paradise*, and *The Way You Look Tonight*. [I hope Ken doesn't mind the copy editor pointing out that he first heard this song by **The Jaguars**, a 1950s doo wop group, whose version mesmerized him - RC]. The final song in the series was the classic Bennett song *But Beautiful*. Again, Steve's Roland provided the background rhythm, particularly in the treble, with John's accompaniments on the jazz sax. Switching to a Latin theme, they performed and sang *Brazil* (soprano saxophone) with a terrific Brazilian swing and accompaniment, followed by Jerome Kern's *A Fine Romance* with saxophone accompaniment.

Just when we were finally settling in, they sprang a spirited Italian Neapolitan song upon us, with wonderful Italian rhythms: *Maruzella* (Renato Carosone), which Steve sang in Italian. Next up was another Italian song, *Guarda Che Luna*, originally recorded as a typical 50's Italian ballad, but interpreted by Steve as a Tango using an accordion bandoneon style with an impressive, powerful full bass sound - sung in Italian, of course. This was followed by spirited vocal/musical renditions of *Guaglione* and *Sway*, and the program finally closed with the classic *Al Di La*, made famous in America by Connie Francis, who recorded the first English language version in 1962. Concluding their program, Steve and John received a standing ovation.

The professional chemistry between Steve and John was evident, with perfect coordination of accordion, winds, vocal solos and duets. Many thanks to both of them for a terrific afternoon of wonderful musical and song. Also, many thanks to Paul Cain, who expertly made the audio and video happen so flawlessly today. People tuning in from home said the audiovisual quality of this Zoom cast was exemplary!

WHAT NOT TO DO WHILE PLAYING...

It's tough to gain confidence and play the accordion, especially when you are a beginner. When you feel you are ready to play a song for your audience, there are a few pointers you might want to consider.

First, don't start with a statement like, "I don't know if I know this, but here goes nothing!". Boy, that lets us know we are in for a disaster. Instead, start off with the song title and composer and maybe a sentence or two about the song's history. Then gain your composure and start!

If you make a mistake, DO NOT say: "Oops!" It really is embarrassing when you say that over and over throughout your performance. Just keep playing and gain your composure. Sometimes players just start over, which is okay... Just take a deep breath before you start in again.

Control those bellows! Don't slam into your song at any point, especially not at the end! Don't end the song with the air button - and air pushed out of the accordion! And PLEASE use the proper register (shift) to play your piece. MASTER is NOT the optimum sound... Try violin, clarinet, bassoon (jazz).

Don't make grimacing faces while performing. Don't stick your tongue out. And NO FOOT TAPPING, that is way too distracting. Keep smiling, focus, relax, and *control that accordion!* WOW ... is that all?

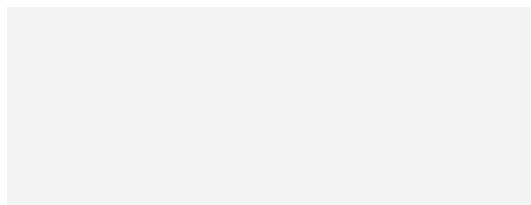
