The **Aurora Mandolin Ensemble**, with accordionist **Don Nurisso** will be playing for us this month. The Aurora Mandolin Orchestra (AMO), is the largest orchestra of its kind in the San Francisco Bay Area and consists of up to thirty professional and amateur musicians (mandolin, mandola, mandocello, guitar, string bass, accordion, flute and percussion). What makes this group unique is its varied repertoire including traditional and semi-classical Italian, Spanish, Russian, specialty ethnic and contemporary orchestral compositions. The Aurora Mandolin Ensemble (AME) is a subset of the orchestra that allows the group to perform for smaller venues, like our accordion club meeting.

Mike took his music studies very seriously, and eventually earned a Masters Degree in Music from San Jose State, where his performance concentrations were voice and classical organ. Mike has entertained audiences in innumerable venues, and has a broad repertoire ranging from American standards to jazz, and from European popular songs to classical music.

COTATI 2012

The Cotati Accordion Festival was, as usual, a very special event this year. The Festival organizers do their best to bring in a diversity of music and acts that will appeal not only to accordionists, but to people from the general public who are interested in an eclectic mix of entertainment featuring the accordion in a multicultural stew. In its 22 year life span, the Festival has donated over \$350,000 to community groups, much of which has gone to the support of music and arts in the schools.

In this year's printed souvenir Festival Program, we were pleased and honored to see the tribute to Val Kieser, as well as those for SFAC members Frank Marocco and Tom Cordoni.

Headlining the Festival this year was the legendary **Dick Contino**, supported by the piano playing of well known SFAC member, **Ron Borelli**. Also notable were the performances of the up and coming young artist **Alicia Baker**, the great **Santiago Jimenez Band** and for the first time this Festival, "Future Accordion Stars", featuring an impressive roster of young accordion talent from the area. There was, of course, the traditional and much anticipated "Lady-of-Spain-A-Ring", led by the Accordion Princess herself - Big Lou (also an SFAC member), who later appeared in her own act "Big Lou's Dance Party." I'll bet you didn't know we can boast Royalty among our membership! The Accordion Babes were featured in their own showcase - stay tuned for our January meeting when we plan to bring them to our stage. Several rocking bands of young players such as **Chervona and The Black-Eyed Dempseys**, and performers who are already familiar to us, such as **Tatiana Semichastany** and **Steve Albini** and **the Great Morgani** (coming in December) added to the festivities.

The San Francisco Accordion Club made its presence known at the Festival with a sheet music sale and a special membership offer for Festival attendees who have never been San Francisco Accordion Club members before. We sold almost \$300 worth of music and books generously donated by members and we gained two new members. We welcome fellow accordionists Pamela Tom of Davis and Sima Zeiger of San Rafael to the club! A very special Thank You to Don and Carol Nurisso, Mike Zampiceni, Scotty Williamson and Sharon and Gus Greyhosky for "holding down the fort."

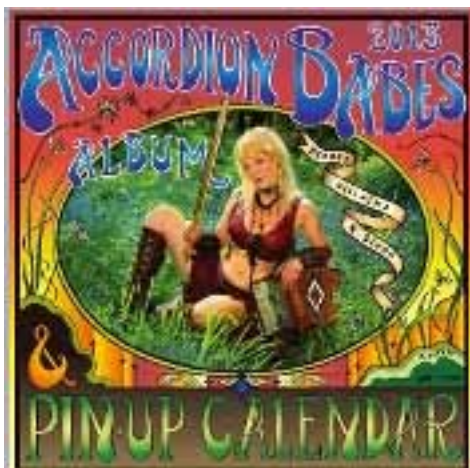
